E-FILING IN ALLEN COUNTY COURTS

Voluntary for Attorneys on February 6, 2017 Mandatory for Attorneys on April 7, 2017

What you need to do:

- 1. Visit <u>courts.in.gov/efile</u> to select an E-Filing Service Provider (EFSP). An EFSP will allow you to e-file documents with the Court. An 'E-Filing User Guide' is also available on this page and will provide general information regarding the transition. The Clerk and Court will be using a different interface and will not be in a position to provide training or troubleshoot for e-filers. Each EFSP will offer various features and cost structures.
- 2. Review <u>IN Trial Rule 86</u> for the latest rules applicable to e-filing.
- 3. <u>REDACT</u> confidential information from filings. See <u>IN Administrative</u> <u>Rule 9</u> for additional information. The Clerk is not responsible for auditing filings to uncover confidential information. Sanctions may be imposed by the Court for noncompliance with this rule.
- 4. Have patience. This will be a major transition for everyone involved in the judicial system. New procedures are being implemented throughout the Courts and will change nearly every aspect of case processing.
